**Assessment:**

Each pupil will complete one extended answer per module, marked by the class teacher. Feedback will be given to the pupil on how to improve their answer, and subsequently pupils will use Refine Time to make improvements. There will be other optional formative assessments throughout each module – such as quizzes, mini-assessments, peer and self-assessments, class discussions.

**Homework:**

In KS3, all pupils will be set homework where it complements the work they are doing in class and the study skills they need to develop. The type and length of homework set will therefore vary according to requirements. Homework will be set once per fortnight, following the whole school policy. Homework will be set via the Bromcom Student portal and be visible on the MCAS app for parents, Homework will be submitted through Google classroom. All homework will be set using these systems and pupils can access it at home with their appropriate log in details.
