What is Prevent?

Prevent is part of the government's counter-terrorism strategy known as CONTEST. It is early intervention and prevention in a non-criminal space and is embedded within safeguarding.

The aim of Prevent is to tackle the causes of radicalisation, and to safeguard and support those at risk of radicalisation by violent extremists.

Attendance Percentage	Days missed in one year	Lessons missed in one year
99%	2	12
98%	4	24
95%	11	66
90%	20	120
85%	30	180
80%	40	240

The school year for pupils consists of 38 weeks = 190 school days = 380 sessions

Pupils under 90% attendance are considered by the Government as being persistently absent from school

Impact of arriving late in school

When a young person arrives late to school they are missing valuable tutorial time, the teachers instructions for the day and introduction to the lesson.

Every minute that a student is late is time lost and if they are regularly late the number of lessons or school days missed can create disadvantages.

The amount of time lost from learning if a pupil is consistently late for school.

Minutes Late	Lessons a week missed *	Days lost in a year
5	0.5	3.5
10	1	7
15	1.5	10.5
20	2	14
25	2.5	17.5
30	3	21

*Based on 50 minute lessons
