The Youth Loneliness Scale Project is looking for young people aged 10 - 24 years to take part in group interviews to provide feedback on a questionnaire created to measure loneliness in young people.

For this study we are looking for young people to take part in group interviews to help us find any problems with a questionnaire that aims to measure loneliness in young people.

- Interviews will take place at your school with young people in the same age group as you.
- For the interview, you will be asked to respond to written questions about loneliness. Two members of our research team will be at the interview; one of us will ask questions whilst the other makes notes so we don't forget the important things you tell us.
- You will be asked to think out loud while responding to the questions so that we can check that what we are asking about makes sense.
- The interviews will be audio recorded so our team can listen back and learn from what you have told us, but no one else will hear it.
- For taking part, you will receive a £15 voucher as a thank-you for your time.
- You do not need to have experienced loneliness to take part. We are interested in a broad range of experiences from people who experience loneliness often, to those who almost never experience it.

By helping us to develop a new measure of loneliness you may help other young people who are experiencing loneliness to get the right help in the future.

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UK Government

Are you over State Pension age, or know someone who is?

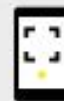
Pension Credit tops up pension income and can help with day-to-day living costs.

If you are over State Pension age, you may be eligible to claim **Pension Credit**, even if you own your home or have savings. People who claim **Pension Credit** may also be able to get:

- The Winter Fuel Payment and other help with heating costs
- Help with rent and Council Tax
- A free TV Licence for those aged 75 or over
- Help with the cost of NHS services, such as NHS dental treatment, glasses and transport costs for hospital appointments

You could be eligible for **Pension Credit** if your weekly income is below £218.15 or, if you have a partner who lives with you, £332.95. Qualifying income level may be higher in some circumstances.
