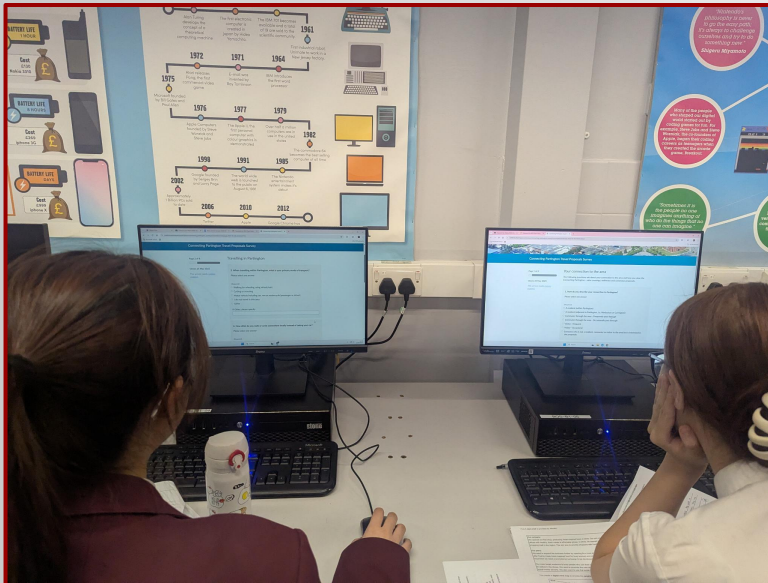

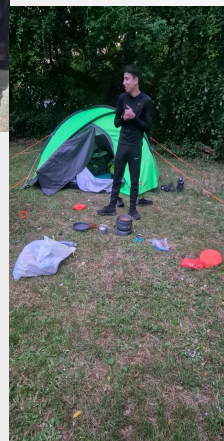
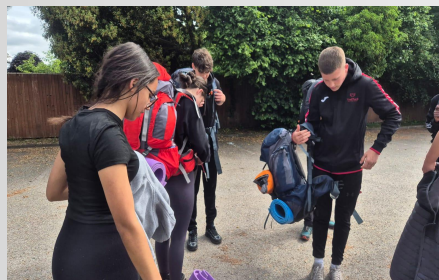

TOURETTE'S AWARENESS MONTH 2025

MAY 15TH - JUNE 15TH 2025

Tourette syndrome (TS) is a genetically determined neurological condition, the key features of which are tics, involuntary and uncontrollable sounds and movements. TS is a complex condition and many people with the condition will also experience other symptoms and conditions. Tourette's syndrome remains one of the most misunderstood neurological conditions. Public perceptions are often shaped by stigma, jokes, and misinformation which can be hurtful, shaming and cause further misunderstanding, conceptions and a negative lived experience for those with this condition.

This year's theme, #Misunderstood, aims to raise awareness of the real, everyday challenges faced by those with TS and help to challenge stigma and myth about the condition, making it easier for individuals to live openly and be supported.
